- 3. A Transcript of Records will be issued by the receiving institution no later than 5 weeks after the assessment period has finished at the receiving HEI.
- 4. Termination of the agreement

The inter-institutional agreement may be amended by mutual agreement. The inter-institutional agreement may be terminated by either party. In the event of unilateral termination, a notice of at least one academic year should be given. In case of termination of present agreement both parties engage themselves to fully meet the commitments undertaken in this agreement, or will make the necessary arrangements with mutual consent.

Neither the European Commission nor the National Agencies can be held responsible in case of a conflict.
